Headteacher's Comment:

This week I was delighted to celebrate attendance with our children. Over 30 children enjoyed a hot chocolate and biscuit to celebrate 100% attendance, and a further 14 children were recognised for improved attendance. It was really lovely to sit together, chat, and enjoy a hot chocolate as a group. Moments like these remind us how much children value being in school and being celebrated for their efforts.

Thank you, as always, for your continued support with attendance. We kindly ask that you continue to telephone the school office on the morning each day that your child is unwell and unable to attend. We also ask that parents follow NHS guidance when deciding whether children are well enough to come to school. Clear communication helps us to support families and children effectively. A reminder about the start of the school day: although the school gates open at 8.25am, classroom doors do not open until 8.30am, and the gate closes at 8.40am. The beginning of the day is an important time for children to settle, connect with their class and teacher, and prepare for learning. Arriving on time really helps children to start the day calmly and confidently. I would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents about school uniform expectations. Wearing the correct uniform helps children feel part of the school community and supports a calm, purposeful start to the day. Please ensure that children are wearing the correct school uniform each day, including appropriate footwear, and that all items are clearly labelled. If you are experiencing any difficulties with uniform, please speak to the class teacher, SLT or the school office in confidence.

Parent consultations are coming up, and we would strongly encourage all parents to book an appointment. These meetings are an important opportunity to discuss your child's progress, strengths, and next steps, as well as to ask any questions you may have. If you are experiencing any difficulty booking an appointment, please speak to your child's teacher or contact the school office, who will be happy to help. We look forward to seeing you at the consultations.

This week we have also noticed a small number of toys being brought into school. We would like to remind parents that toys should not be brought into school, unless specifically requested by a teacher. Toys can become a distraction, may get lost or damaged, and can sometimes cause upset between children. Thank you for your support with this.

Finally, a reminder about parking. We ask all parents and carers to park considerately, being mindful of our neighbours as well as the safety of our children at drop-off and pick-up times. Where possible, please use the Village Hall car park, we are very lucky to have access to this space, and it helps to keep the area around the school safe for everyone.
