Headteacher's Comment:

As we come to the end of week three, it was lovely to see so many of you at the Parent Welcome Meetings. We hope these sessions gave you the chance to meet your child's teacher, find out what the year ahead may look like, and understand what to expect from their learning journey. Working in partnership with you is so important, and these meetings are a key way of building those strong home-school links.

This week, I had the pleasure of hearing an incredibly inspirational speaker who spoke about the lifelong importance of reading. Their words really resonated with us as a school, as they reinforced something we already believe deeply, that reading is one of the most powerful tools we can give our children. We ask that children share a book with an adult a minimum of four times a week, and ideally five times or more. We know that the habits children build now have a lasting impact, which is why we have developed a rich and engaging curriculum to provide as many opportunities as possible for learning. But you, as parents and carers, are absolutely vital in this process. The time you spend interacting with your child, asking questions, looking at pictures together, or exploring new words, helps them become active participants in their own reading journey. The power of the conversations we have with our children cannot be overstated. Research shows that these daily interactions help to develop:

- Brain structure, building strong neural connections
- Brain function, strengthening memory and thinking skills
- Reading skills, improving comprehension and fluency
- Social-emotional development, building empathy and emotional understanding
- Executive function and reasoning, supporting problem-solving and decision-making
- Vocabulary skills, expanding language and communication abilities

Together, we can nurture a love of reading and give our children the very best start in life. Thank you for the time, energy, and encouragement you give your children, it really does make a difference.

This week, our Year 6 children proudly shared their manifestos for the Head Pupil positions, they were enthusiastic, well written, and brilliantly presented. Well done to everyone who took part, and a huge congratulations to Maddie and Sid T, our new Head Pupils, and to Heidi and Oliver, our Deputy Pupils – we know they will represent our school wonderfully!

Attendance Club started again this week, and the children have loved exploring the new figures – be ready to hear all about them when they come home! Thank you for your continued support, have a lovely weekend.


